Jesuit Support to the Ukraine Crisis

24/02/2022 - 31/12/2022 ANNUAL REPORT

The initiation of an International Armed Conflict in Ukraine on 24/02/2022 has caused the largest humanitarian crisis in Europe in recent history. Millions have been forced to flee their homes, and millions more remain displaced or in need in Ukraine. Upon the outbreak of this conflict, the Society of Jesus coordinated a global response through the Jesuit Refugee Service (JRS) and Xavier Network in Ukraine, neighboring countries, and the rest of Europe to welcome, protect, promote, and integrate those in need.

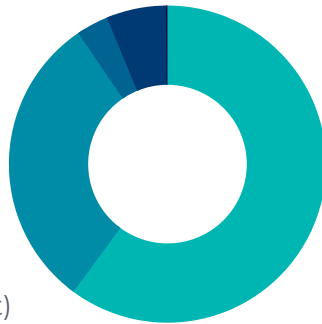

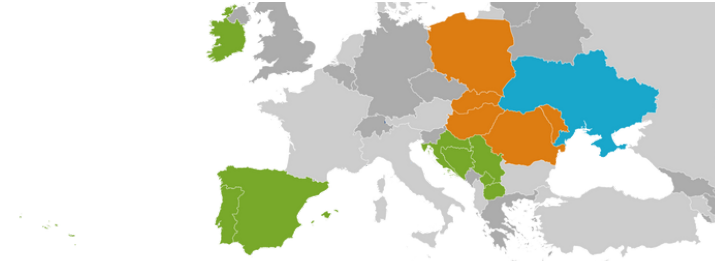
Viola's Story

51-years-old Viola used to work in an orchestra in Nicolaev as a music teacher. She had to flee her hometown of Nicolaev with her 15-year-old son, when they saw "no more ending approaching". In the spring of 2022, they arrived in Moldova, struggling to find a place to live. Concordia's team helped them find warmth, safety, and support. "Thanks to you, we were able to escape the cold, heal and start building a new life."

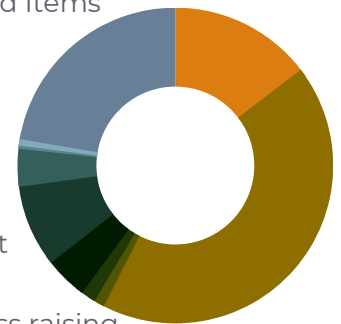

Sturnikova's Story

On 24/2, Sturnikova was awoken in Kharkiv by the shelling. "I couldn't really believe it wasn't a nightmare, but when in the bathroom my glass shook from another blow, I realized that this wasn't a bad dream". She sought refuge in Nowy Sącz, where she is supported by JRS Poland. "I see a lot of support here and the kind of psychological help JRS provides. You are dragging out my compatriots of the chasm they have fallen into".
