INTERIM REPORT

The initiation of an International Armed Conflict in Ukraine on the 24/02/2022 has caused the largest humanitarian crisis in Europe in recent history. Millions have been forced to flee their homes, and millions more remain displaced or in need in Ukraine. Upon the outbreak of this conflict, the Society of Jesus coordinated a global response through JRS and Xavier Network in Ukraine, in the neighboring countries and in the rest of Europe to welcome, protect, promote and integrate those in need.

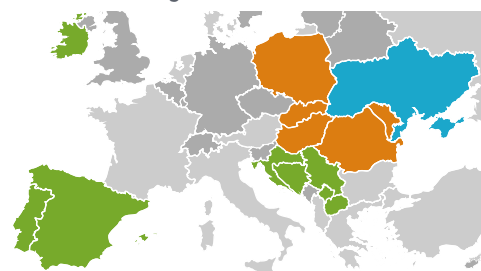

Financial overview

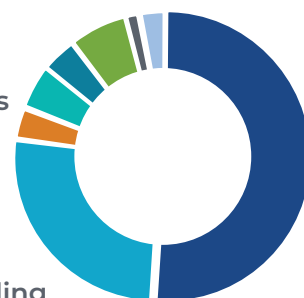
- 35% Pillar 1 Welcome (Short-term aid)
- 41% Pillar 2 Protect (Medium-term aid)
- 5% Pillar 3 Promote (Long-term aid)
- 2% Pillar 4 Integrate (Long-term support)
- 17% Institutional Strenghtening (Capacity building)



Total: €940,577.04 **3-year:** €12,286,334.17

Activities overview

- 51% Emergency, Aid, relief, assistance
- 26% Shelter, Non food Items
- 3% Legal Assistance
- 5% Psychological Support
- 4% Health
- 7% Education
- 1% Livelihood
- 2% Integration/Peacebuilding

Olena's Story

When Olena received a call that Kyiv airport was under fire, she knew she had to flee. After a 25-hour drive, she found "very high hospitality from the Romanian people that we could never imagine receiving". Today, Olena is supported by JRS Romania. "Romania, is not the country I have lived in, but is the first one where I feel rested and supported".



Liudmila's Story

Liudmila had to flee her hometown with her two children when the conflict arrived at her doorstep, but she has not lost her hope of one day returning home. Today, the three of them are supported by JRS Ukraine. "We felt like we were adopted into a friendly family. It is so precious and vital to feel such support. Their help is priceless to us!".
