JRS Commitment:	<p>JRS pledges to undertake a review of its record on climate action and to take steps to integrate environmentally sustainable practices within the organization at programmatic and organizational levels. The review shall enable JRS to better understand the diverse impacts of the climate crisis and to see how JRS programs, namely, education, MHPSS, livelihoods and reconciliation, may enhance the resilience of refugee and host communities in the face of climate stresses and their consequences, such as weather induced disasters, communal conflicts over scarce resources.</p> <p>JRS pilots the outcome of its review in Eastern Africa.</p>
