JRS pledges to enhance the protection and resilience of Rohingya refugees in Bangladesh and expanding solutions beyond providing Mental Health and Psychosocial Support (MHPSS) that will enable Rohingya children, youth, and the adults to live a dignified life. JRS pledges to start up protection and educational activities for Rohingya refugees in Malaysia. JRS pledges provide emergency response to the Rohingya boat arrivals in Indonesia.
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
